Dear Parents/Carers,

These first three evenings of this week, we welcome our parents to grade/class information evenings to provide an outline of your child's class journey in learning for the year. This is a great start for many families and teachers in getting to know each other.

During your time together this week, the focus is on what the class will be doing - that broader context. If you wish to speak with your child's teacher in depth about your child, we should give that conversation the time and attention it deserves. Please make an alternate time if required.

With each new grade comes new opportunities for our students to develop further as learners. There will be challenges for your child in this new year and sometimes even setbacks. To enable your child to make the most of these challenges, help them become better problem solvers by inviting their thoughts as to solutions they might plan and implement. We all, out of our caring, sometimes are drawn to 'rescue' the child instead of enabling them to rise to challenges. There is an educational term "Roaming Around the Known" which is where the child is not engaging in any new learning, just going over what he/she already knows. Asking challenging "why do you think...." or "how would you find out...." questions enable students to move beyond the known and it's here that Deep learning takes place. We will be focusing at school on not just the "what" questions but furthering the students' thinking and learning with exploring issues of "why" and "how". I invite you to do the same with your child. If a child says "I don't know" to a deeper question, perhaps she/he doesn't know the words to use to explain or maybe the challenge has not been there to think deeper!

Lots to think about and we will be exploring this together over the year! Enjoy the evenings. Remember that child minding has been arranged here so you can attend.

SCHOOL FEES 2018

Families will be receiving their School Fees statement shortly in the mail. These statements are sent from the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) outlining the 2018 school fees for your child(ren).

Included in this first Tax Invoice are the Payment Plans families can adopt for their 2018 tuition fees.

Instructions will be included, should you wish to utilise the Direct Debit or BPay options.

PLEASE NOTE: Any outstanding amount in a family's school fee account **will not receive** the BPay or Direct Debit plans for 2018 fees. Please contact the school on 9933.7800 or via email: cnalletamby@parra.catholic.edu.au if you wish to enquire about your account.



ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL

Supervision begins at 8:25am. Children should not be left at school before this time.

A 'kiss and drop' zone operates in the morning if you do not wish to walk your child into school. Adults must stay in the car at all times if using the 'kiss and drop' zone. The children's bags must be in the car with them to ensure they can exit quickly. At no time can a car be left unattended in the 'kiss and drop' zone. If you wish to walk your child into school, please drive up the ramp to the car park. Children take their bags to the classroom and then must go straight to the playground for supervision. No one is to remain in the building before school unless they have made a formal appointment with a staff member. If this is the case, you must sign in at the office. Parents who come down onto the playground are asked to stand to the side and allow their child to socialise with the other children on the playground. The perimeter gates are locked each morning. The Barrier Drive main gate entrance remains open during the day.

DEPARTURE FROM SCHOOL

School finishes at 3:20pm and we appreciate your efforts to pick up your child promptly at that time.

Supervision ceases at 3:40pm. The 'kiss and drop' zone does not operate in the afternoon. Parents/caregivers are required to park in the top car park and collect children from the designated point outside the building. Please do not go into the building to collect children from classrooms. Please note, children are not allowed to walk to the car park and meet their parents. They must be collected from the teacher. The perimeter gates are closed after the last bus leaves in the afternoon. If there is an emergency and you are late to collect your child, please contact the school office. Children can become anxious when parents are late or they are unclear about their afternoon arrangements.

Students arriving before 8:25am or remaining at school after 3:30pm are required to be enrolled in COSHC. Students are not to be left outside the school main gate unsupervised. This is a child protection issue of grave concern. To make arrangements with COSHC, phone: 0417 203 333.

This allows for the safe passage of other cars through the car park whilst also maximising the safety of all pedestrians, including all children, at all times.
