NUMERACY NEWS

This Year the staff have been completing Professional learning about "Multiplicative thinking." During the program the staff have examined what multiplicative thinking is and the different multiplicative structures that students can use. Each member of staff has then completed different multiplicative thinking tasks with students and worked together to examine the students understanding of these concepts examining how we can work together to further develop students multiplicative thinking skills.

What is Multiplicative thinking?

Multiplicative thinking is characterised by:

• a capacity to work flexibly and efficiently with an extended range of numbers (for example, larger whole numbers, decimals, common fractions, ratio, and percent),

• an ability to recognise and solve a range of problems involving multiplication or division including direct and indirect proportion, and

• the means to communicate this effectively in a variety of ways (for example, words, diagrams, symbolic expressions, and written algorithms).

There are many different multiplication strategies students can use to solve multiplication problems. These include:

Group: The group strategy for multiplication is introduced by asking students to make equal groups and then count how many altogether. Later they can match pictorial representations with symbolic representations. $3 \times 3 = 9$, 3 groups of 3, three 3s, 3 multiplied by 3. Once students understand the relationship between the pictures and the symbols, it provides them with a symbolic representation and asks them to draw a matching picture or make matching groups.





<u>Array</u>: The array strategy is the preferred strategy for teaching multiplication facts because it emphasises the commutativity of those facts. Students are exposed to arrays regularly in their everyday life in the form of egg cartons, chocolate bars, packets of biscuits, students in lines and so on.



Over the next few weeks we will be looking at other multiplication structures and strategies.
