

Welcome back to Term Two.

In the coming weeks we will be inviting students, teachers and parents to provide feedback on their experience of our school using an online survey. The surveys are an important part of our whole school evaluation and planning process. This survey process replaces the previous Quality Catholic Schools survey that some of you would have participated in.

We would like to invite parents to complete the *Tell Them From Me (TTFM)* Partners in Learning survey. As we value the role of parents and carers within our school community we would greatly appreciate your feedback. The information you provide will be used to maintain our commitment to working together in partnership to further improve student learning and wellbeing at Mary Immaculate Primary School. The survey is anonymous and will take approximately 20 minutes to complete. More details will soon be sent home.

Our court area is being completed this week using the \$50000 grant funds received from the state government through Mr Kevin Conolly! We will be putting in a submission to the state government for a ramp to be constructed down from the top car park. We had applied for this last year but were unsuccessful. We have also applied for CEDP capital works funding to have our six toilet blocks refurbished.

Over the holiday break, staff from our school and from John 23rd Primary participated in a Professional Learning Experience to San Francisco. This was a hugely successful and valuable experience for both schools. We visited several schools in and around that part of California. Our visit focused on Student learning, achievement and engagement. We witnessed very high performing primary and secondary schools. While we learned a considerable amount that we will look to implement in our practices at MIPS, we were very much affirmed that we too are operating at the forefront of effective student learning. Our PBL and Student-led Conference initiatives were also featured at these other high performing schools.


Seesaw should be accessible to all parents. Please let us know if you can not access it so we can assist you. I look forward to another great term of learning and fun at MIPS!


SCHOOL FEES 2018

ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL

Supervision begins at 8:25am.
Children should not be left at school before this time.

A 'kiss and drop' zone operates in the morning if you do not wish to walk your child into school. Adults must stay in the car at all times if using the 'kiss and drop' zone. The children's bags must be in the car with them to ensure they can exit quickly. At no time can a car be left unattended in the 'kiss and drop' zone. If you wish to walk your child into school, please drive up the ramp to the car park. Children take their bags to the classroom and then must go straight to the playground for supervision. No one is to remain in the building before school unless they have made a formal appointment with a staff member. If this is the case, you must sign in at the office. Parents who come down onto the playground are asked to stand to the side and allow their child to socialise with the other children on the playground. The perimeter gates are locked each morning. The Barnier Drive main gate entrance remains open during the day.

DEPARTURE FROM SCHOOL

School finishes at 3:20pm and we appreciate your efforts to pick up your child promptly at that time. Supervision ceases at 3:40pm. The 'kiss and drop' zone does not operate in the afternoon. Parents/ caregivers are required to park in the top car park and collect children from the designated point outside the building. Please do not go into the building to collect children from classrooms. Please note, children are not allowed to walk to the car park and meet their parents. They must be collected from the teacher. The perimeter gates are closed after the last bus leaves in the afternoon. If there is an emergency and you are late to collect your child, please contact the school office. Children can become anxious when parents are late or they are unclear about their afternoon arrangements.

Students arriving before 8:25am or remaining at school after 3:30pm are required to be enrolled in COSHC. Students are not to be left outside the school main gate unsupervised. This is a child protection issue of grave concern.

CARPARK ETIQUETTE

Parents are reminded that all cars need to be parked in **Marked spaces only.** This allows for the safe passage of other cars through the car park whilst also maximising the safety of all pedestrians, including all children, at all times. Please respect other members of the community by using the car park in a safe and respectful manner.

STUDENT BANKING - This Friday 4th May

Student banking will continue this Friday. Please send your child's Dollarmites book to the classroom teacher for processing.

SPARE UNDERWEAR REQUEST

Can we please request a pair of spare underwear as well as socks for boys and socks/stockings for girls in your child's school bag. Little accidents may occur. Also if your child has borrowed spare clothes from our school office can you please return them to the office as soon as possible. Thank you.



NAPLAN 2018: Tuesday 15th - Thursday 17th May 2018

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3 and 5. It has been an everyday part of the school calendar since 2008.

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- reading
- writing
- language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- numeracy.

NAPLAN tests skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time through the school curriculum. While participation by all students is expected, students may be withdrawn from the testing program by their parent/carer. This is a matter for consideration by individual parents/carers. Withdrawals are intended to address issues such as religious beliefs and philosophical objections to testing. A formal application in the manner specified must be received by the principal prior to the testing. Forms are available from the front office and must be returned by this Friday 4th May, 2018.






